CHILD DEVELOPMENT

Introduction

Child Development is an exciting subject aimed at giving you an insight into your future. You will look at the responsibilities of parenthood and how to prepare for a new arrival. The course then follows the pregnancy process through until birth and beyond, showing how a child develops physically, intellectually, emotionally and socially up to the age of 5.

As part of the course you will get to experience what it is like to be a new parent by looking after one of our electronic babies for a weekend. You will be inspired by professionals working with families and children and will get to hear first-hand experiences from mums and dads.



What will it be like?

The course is broken up into three units of study as follows:

- Reproduction
- Diet and lifestyle during pregnancy
- Birth & the new born Baby
- Feeding a new born baby
- 2. The Development of the Child (0-5 years)
- Dietary needs of the child (0-5years)
- Child Health and Education
- Child Development
- Physical and Intellectual development
- Emotional and Social development
- Communication Development
- 3. <u>Controlled Assessment An investigation into an area of child development</u> The Coursework title is released by C.C.E.A in the September of year 12.

Assessment

Two Exams and one Controlled Assessment

2 x 1 hour 15 minutes' exams = 2 x 30% = 60% Controlled Assessment = 40% (one exam in year 11, and one exam in Year 12) (the title is released in the September of Year 12)
